CLARIFICATIONS FOR PROCEDURES FOR MAIL-IN VOTING

KANSAS CITY, MO (July 13, 2020) – Mail-In voting for the August 4th Primary Election begun for Kansas City voters on June 23rd.

Different from traditional absentee voting, a voter who decides to vote a Mail-In ballot does not need an excuse, however, MUST have their ballot envelope notarized. Registered Missouri voters can <u>only</u> request a Mail-In ballot <u>IN-PERSON OR BY MAIL ONLY</u>. This option will be available for both the August 4th Primary and the November 3rd General Election.

***ALL MAIL-IN BALLOT REQUESTS MUST BE MADE IN PERSON OR MAILED. THEY CAN
NOT BE E-MAILED OR FAXED***

The last day to submit a Mail-In ballot application for the August 4th election is Wednesday, July 22, 2020.

Voters who casts a Mail-In ballot <u>must</u> send it **BY MAIL ONLY** and it must be received by the Election Board no later than 7 p.m., Tuesday, August 4th to be counted.

A NOTARY IS REQUIRED FOR ALL MAIL-IN BALLOTS
