Absentee Voting Begins for November 5 Election

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (Sept. 24, 2013) – Today is the first day Kansas City voters can cast an absentee ballot for the November 5 election.

Voters who qualify, may vote an absentee ballot in-person until 5 p.m. Monday, November 4 or by mail. Ballots cast by mail must be received by the Election Board no later than 7 p.m., Tuesday, November 5.

Voting will be available at the Kansas City Election Board office, located in Union Station (30 W. Pershing Road) beginning Tuesday, September 24, 8 a.m. -5 p.m. through Monday, November 4. The office will also be open for absentee voting on Saturday, November 2, 8 a.m. to noon.

For mail-in voting, an application form must be submitted to KCEB. The form is available at <u>www.kceb.org</u>, or by calling KCEB's absentee voting office at 816-842-4820 ext. 225.

Missouri election laws allow registered voters to vote absentee if they meet one of the following five requirements:

- 1) Will be absent from their voting jurisdiction on Election Day
- 2) Are incapacitated or confined due to illness or physical disability, or caring for an incapacitated person
- 3) Are restricted by religious belief or practice
- 4) Are employed by an election authority
- 5) Are incarcerated, but have retained all voting qualifications

Voters will be deciding on whether or not to approve a sales tax to fund a medical research institute.

The polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 5.

New residents who have moved into Kansas City must register by October 9 in order to be eligible to vote in the November 5 election. Voters who have moved since they last voted, should submit a change of address form by mail (30 W. Pershing Road, Suite 2800, Kansas City, MO 64108), fax (816-221-3348) or in person (KCEB Office, Suite 2800) to KCEB to be assured of receiving a new voter ID card and their new polling location.

Kansas City has 211,706 registered voters.
