New Voter ID Cards for Kansas City Voters

WHAT: The Kansas City Election Board (KCEB) mailed out new voter identification cards to all registered voters in Kansas City. The cards are red, white and blue, and are perforated for easy folding. The card contains the voter's name and address, voter ID number, polling location, voting districts, ward and precinct number, and registration date.

WHO: Registered voters in Kansas City within Jackson County.

WHEN: New cards should have arrived in voters' mailboxes between March 19-26.

WHY: Missouri statutes require that registered voters receive new voter identification cards every two years. The Election Board is encouraging voters to always carry the cards in their wallets and to present them to election judges when voting. Voters will still have the option of using other approved forms of identification, such as a driver's license, government ID, college ID, etc., when asked to present identification at the polls.
