## ABSENTEE SATELLITE VOTER INFORMATION CENTERS OPEN OCTOBER 14

(Kansas City, MO) —The Kansas City Election Board will open five Absentee Satellite Voter Information Centers throughout the city on October 14. These centers provide valuable services to voters preparing for the upcoming November 4 general election. They will supplement the Absentee Voter Information Center which began servicing voters at 1828 Walnut, election board headquarters, on September 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The centers are one-stop shops for voting services and information including:

Absentee Voting—citizens who will be absent from their jurisdiction on November 4 may cast a ballot at a satellite center (voters residing in Kansas City, within Jackson County only). Voters may also cast an absentee ballot if: they are confined/incapacitated or caring for someone who is; a religious belief or practice prohibits voting on November 4; employed as an election worker; incarcerated but have retained all voting qualifications.

Address/Name Change Forms—voters arriving at the wrong poll or whose names aren't found in the poll book are often the result of forgetting to update their address after moving. or changing a name due to marriage or divorce. Forms will be available to submit these changes.

Sample Ballots and Poll Locations--voters may view the list of candidates and ballot issues as well as look up the address of their poll location.

Demonstrations and Test Voting—citizens will have the opportunity to practice vote on the TouchScreen voting machine.

First-time Voter FAQ's and Election Information—materials on what to expect at the polls, election day rumors and facts, how to use a provisional ballot and other important information that will enhance voters' election day experience will be available.

Election Worker Applications—citizens are encouraged to sign up to work at a poll on election day. Several categories of workers are still being recruited.

Voter Registration—citizens may register for future elections (registration

## for November 4 closes October 8).

The centers will be open until 7: 00 p.m. each evening (except Fridays at Brush Creek Community Center) and from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturdays. Locations and hours are as follows:
