CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 (RAYTOWN)**

QUESTION

Shall the Consolidated School District No. 2 (Raytown) of Jackson County, Missouri borrow money in the amount of \$22,000,000 for the purpose of constructing, renovating, improving, furnishing and equipping school facilities of the District, including safety and security enhancements, roof replacements, lighting improvements, restrooms, plumbing, electrical and technology upgrades, and renovation and expansion of the existing Raytown South High School athletic facility and issue bonds for the payment thereof?

If this proposition is approved, it is estimated that the debt service levy of the school district will not increase from the existing levy of \$1.17 per one hundred dollars assessed valuation of real and personal property.

QUESTION 1

SHALL THE FOLLOWING BE APPROVED?

Shall the City of Kansas City, Missouri issue and sell waterworks revenue bonds in the principal amount of \$500,000,000.00 for the purpose of extending and improving the waterworks system of the City including, but not limited to (1) the continued expansion of the water distribution system, (2) replacement of water mains, (3) rehabilitation and expansion of water treatment plants, pump stations, and other water facility improvements, (4) ensuring a reliable water supply to include intake modifications and/or supplemental ground water supplies, and (5) protecting and safeguarding the waterworks system, with the principal and interest of said bonds to be payable solely from the revenues derived by the City from the operation of its waterworks system, including all future improvements and expansions thereto?

QUESTION 2

Shall the City of Kansas City be authorized to establish the following fees for permitting, inspecting and regulating lodging establishments such as hotels and motels for the purpose of protecting the public health and safety?

Application fee of \$100.00 for initial lodging establishment applications or modifications of particular requirements and conditions embodied in permits.

Annual Permit Fees to operate and Re-inspection Fees based upon the number of rooms in a lodging establishment as follows:

<u>Number of Rooms</u>	<u>Annual Permit Fee</u>	<u>Re-inspection Fee</u>
Less Than 50	\$150	\$75
50 – 150	\$200	\$100
151 – 300	\$250	\$125
301 – 500	\$300	\$150
501 – 1000	\$350	\$175
Each Additional 300 Rooms	\$50	\$25

Reinstatement Fee of \$250.00 for the reinstatement of any permits that have been suspended.

Late Fees of \$50.00 per month for permit renewals not submitted by January 31 of each year.

Adjustment of fees. Authority to adjust the above-listed fees annually to reflect the change in the consumer price index (CPI) for all items/all urban consumers/Kansas City, Missouri published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The City is also authorized to make cumulative adjustments for those years in which fees were not previously adjusted.
